1. Introduction

The Alliance for Affordable Internet (A4AI) is the world's broadest technology sector coalition working to drive down the cost of Internet access in less developed countries. Comprising over 80 member organisations from across the private, public and not-for-profit sectors, A4AI works through a blend of international advocacy, evidence-based research (such as the annual Affordability Report.) and direct engagements with selected countries, to support policy and regulatory reforms proven to help reduce industry costs and improve broadband affordability for all.

2. Background to the Nigeria Broadband Infrastructure Forum

In 2014, the A4AI-Nigeria Coalition identified the cost of broadband infrastructure deployment including the need for infrastructure sharing on an open access and fair basis as crucial to making broadband more affordable for all Nigerians. Since then, the Coalition has worked on a number of activities and projects to advocate and support the implementation of further policy reforms needed to expand affordable access. As a result, Nigeria endorsed the A4AI "1 for 2" affordability target (now a UN Broadband global target) and has been working to achieve this goal.

Objectives of this forum:

- I. Assess progress to date to achieve relevant broadband targets and objectives established by the Nigerian Broadband Plan.
- II. Understand the key barriers to progress; and identify key priorities for the new and updated 5 years National Broadband Plan.
- III. Convene all holders of ICT Infrastructure in Nigeria, including those outside the telecommunications sector (e.g., power, energy, real estate), to collaborate on good practices for sharing and to agree on action items that will see to increased infrastructure sharing and the driving down of deployment costs.

IV. Develop initial solutions to ensure an enabling environment, with strong incentives for investments that will support market growth and universal affordable access to all Nigerians, with a focus on women and girls, rural population and the poor.
